ESSAY #3 FULL DRAFT: DUE FRI. DEC. 9th (11:59 pm)

FORMAT: Typed, double-spaced; 750 – 900 words (3 to 3-1/2 pages) plus Works Cited page.

As before, turn in your 2 historical photos on an extra page after your Works Cited page.

The following (updated) guidelines should help you make sure your final draft is 'complete.'

- **Argument and Essay Structure:**

- ❑ About 3-1/2 to 4 pages of essay writing, including:

- ❑ Introduction and thesis (1 page)
 - ❑ Body/evidence paragraphs (about **2** pages)
 - ❑ Conclusion (about 1/2 page)

- **Final Evidence Checklist (AVOIDING PLAGIARISM):**

- ❑ Are all words in your essay your own?
 - ❑ If they are not, are they in quotes? Are they cited?
 - ❑ Are there sentences with paraphrased ideas (facts / opinions from others)? If so, are they cited?
 - ❑ As you proofread your sentences, you must ask yourself:
 - Does this word, phrase or sentence come from a source?
If it does, use quotes and a citation.
 - Does this sentence (which is completely in your own words) express an idea or fact from a source?
If it does, also use a citation. (PARAPHRASE)

IF YOU DO NOT ATTRIBUTE THE IDEAS (PARAPHRASE) AND WORDS (QUOTES) OF YOUR SOURCES, THAT IS PLAGIARISM.
(BOTTOM LINE: MANY OF THE SENTENCES IN YOUR PAPER SHOULD BE CITED.)

● **Works Cited (about 2 pages):**

- ☐ Have you double-spaced your Works Cited entries, indenting the second, third (etc.) lines?
- ☐ Is each entry correctly formatted? See our “Creating a Works Cited Page” handout.
